IAAF World Championships in Athletics Event to be Held in Second Life®

— Users Can Participate in Online Competitions —

Dentsu Inc. (President & COO: Tatsuyoshi Takashima; Head Office: Tokyo; Capital: 58,967.1 million yen), Tokyo Broadcasting System Inc. (President: Hiroshi Inoue; Head Office: Tokyo; Capital: 5,468.5 million yen) and PRESENTCAST INC. (President: Yutaka Ishikawa; Headquarters: Tokyo; Capital: 800 million yen) announced today that together they will hold an IAAF World Championships in Athletics event in the 3-D virtual community Second Life[®] (see Note 1) to coincide with the IAAF World Championships in Athletics Osaka 2007 to be held from August 25 - September 2, 2007.

For the event, an athletics stadium will be built on 1 SIM (see Note 2) of Dentsu's proprietary land known as Virtual Tokyo. Plans are to hold daily competitions in such athletics events as the 100m sprint, shot put, and marathon. Users will be able to experience athletics competitions while, at the same time, competing with other users for the top record.

There are also plans to show video footage related to the actual IAAF World Championships in Athletics on the big-screen TV within the virtual stadium.

Users will be able enjoy fun participating in online marathon competitions on September 1, the day before the terrestrial broadcast of the women's marathon.

This event aims to promote more familiarity with the IAAF World Championships in Athletics and increase their popularity among viewers by having people enjoy watching the Championships on TV in combination with participating in athletics competitions online. Furthermore, by actively promoting the new online service "metaverse" (see Note 3) and using the synergies of broadcasting and communication to develop new methods of promotion and business models, we hope this event will assist us in creating more exciting services for viewers.



Note 1: Second Life® (http://www.secondlife.com/) is a 3-D virtual community (metaverse), operated by the San Francisco, U.S.A.-based company, Linden Lab®, since 2003. There are currently over 8.8 million registered users from more than 100 countries (as of August 15, 2007).

Note 2: A SIM is a standard unit of land measurement in Second Life® and equal to 256 x 256 meters

Note 3: A metaverse is a 3-D virtual world such as Second Life® in which users can participate with their own avatars. Unlike past virtual worlds, users can make and alter objects within the space of the world.
